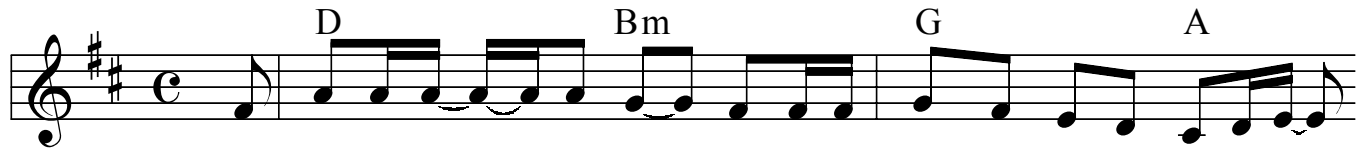


# The Walk To Emmaus

Based on Luke 24: 13-35

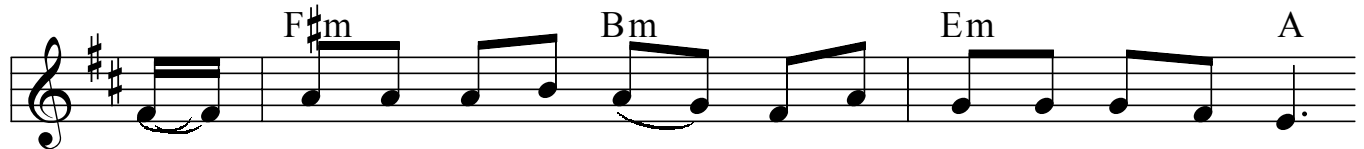

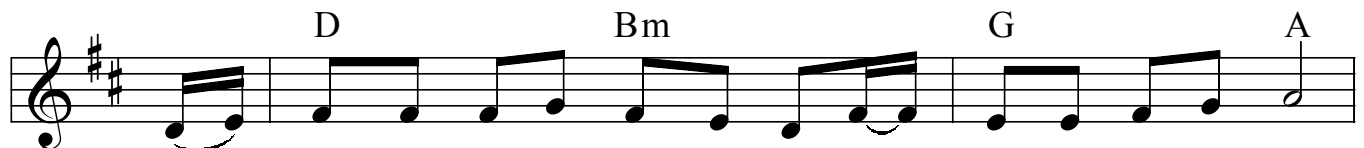
1. Two dis - ci - ples were walk - ing To Em - ma - us from Jer - u - sa - lem,

5. They rose that — ver - y — hour And re - turned with - out de - lay - ing



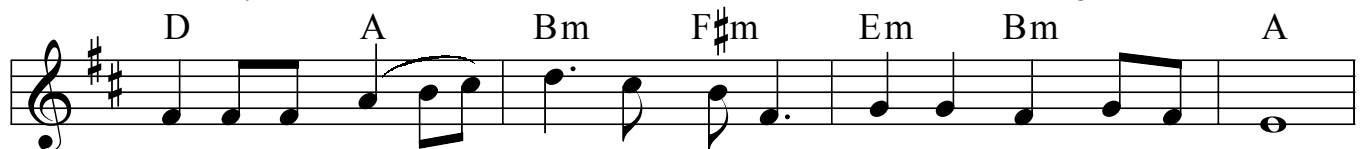
And — as the two were talk - ing, The Lord — drew near and went with them.
