



Cherubim Facing Each Other

“The cherubim shall stretch out their wings above...
and they shall face one another...”
(Exodus 25:20)

Do you see how the cherubim face each other? This symbolizes looking to the Lord and to what is good. Make your own picture of the cherubim facing each other. Be sure to draw their wings so that they touch above the ark.

Materials

thick paper such as cover stock or oaktag
colored construction paper
pencil
scissors
optional: gold or yellow crayon (or gold metallic marker)

Various Procedures

- A. One way to make the cherubim would be to make a template of one cherubim. Draw around it to make a cherubim facing the center of the page. Now flip over the template and draw the cherubim facing the other one. Then color the cherubim gold (or yellow) and mount on paper with a contrasting color. You may want to add a quote from the Word about cherubim such as the one given above.

- B. Another way to make the cherubim would be to make a cherubim template and place it on a folded piece of paper with the tip of the wing touching the fold. Draw around the one cherubim, cut along the line (being careful not to cut through the fold at the tip of the wing) and then unfold the paper. You should have two cherubim facing each other.
