## THE SWEET SMELL OF SPRING

We have now entered the most “heavenly” time of year. This can be said because we are taught that there is “a climate of perpetual spring throughout the angelic heavens” which “corresponds to springtime on earth” (*Divine Love and Wisdom 105*).

This “perpetual spring” comes about because, in heaven, true ideas appear everywhere. *True Christian Religion 353* says:

Every truth shines in heaven, and consequently truth when shining is faith in essence. The beauty and charm faith gets from this illumination, as the truths in it increase in number, can be compared with various shapes, objects and pictures, formed by different colors... Comparison is also possible with the beauty of the rainbow, or of a meadow full of flowers, and of a garden in bloom in early springtime... The raising of faith to a higher level by the volume of truths can be illustrated by comparison with...the increase in fragrance produced by the grouping together of sweet-smelling flowers.

The Lord invites all people to “abide in His love” (*John 15: 9*). The angels do this. They abide in His love and therefore receive from Him the never ending warmth and light that produces the sweetness of spring. And, the more their love for Him and for their neighbors grows, the richer the variety, volume and fragrance of the flowers of spring becomes.

Of all the loves that constitute heaven, one especially stands out. It is the conjugal love existing between one man and one woman. It is the love for marriage that reflects the marriage of goodness and truth within the Lord Himself. In *Conjugal Love* 137 we find an expression of this wonderful love.

While I was once thinking about conjugal love, I suddenly caught sight of two naked little children in the distance, with baskets in their hands and turtledoves flying around them. Then, as they came closer, they looked like naked little children modestly decked out in garlands of flowers. Their heads were decorated with little chaplets of flowers, and their breasts were adorned with sash-like wreaths of blue-colored lilies and roses that hung diagonally from their shoulders to their hips. And round about the two of them appeared what looked like a shared chain of little leaves woven together and interspersed with olives.

When they drew nearer still, however, they did not appear as little children or naked, but as two adults in the bloom of their early youth, dressed in robes and tunics of shining silk, with beautiful-looking flowers woven into them. Moreover, when they stood next to me a spring like warmth wafted down from heaven through them with a sweet-scented fragrance, like the fragrance of first growth in gardens and fields.

The two were a married couple from heaven...

Can we imagine a world in which every adult was experiencing a constant emotional and spiritual springtime as a result of their marriage? In our world it would not matter what the weather outside was doing. For all those experiencing love truly conjugal it would always be spring.

The Lord assures us that this is not as impossible a scenario as it may sometimes seem. When we go back to the Gospel of John as we did a few moments ago, we find the Lord saying, *“If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask whatever you desire, and it shall be done for you”* (John 15: 7).

Are we asking the Lord for the types of things in our hearts and minds that will make His heavenly springtime a reality for us? If not, what is stopping us?

## **THIS MONTH'S UPDATES**

### **Visit from the Bishop and Team:**

In April the Washington Society was pleased to welcome Bishop Tom Kline along with Wayne Parker, Dudley Davis and David Frazier representing the General Church and Academy. The visit provided for a series of presentations on the Church's central vision. This is the vision that we hope will guide our collective plans and actions.

### Core Purpose of the General Church:

To help people throughout the world grow closer to the Lord Jesus Christ in His Second Coming.

### Core Values of the General Church:

- The Old Testament, the New Testament and the Heavenly Doctrines are the Word of God and the foundation of all we do.
- We teach truths, using them to help people lead good and useful lives.
- We establish and support church congregations and schools.
- We believe ongoing, systematic, doctrinally based education is essential to the life and growth of the Church.
- We value marriage between a man and a woman and honor the unique, complimentary nature of each sex.

### **WCNJ Strategic Planning:**

This committee, under the direct supervision of the Board of Trustees is continuing to develop the structural and financial models by which our congregation may reach its 5-year targets.

One part of this work involves the expansion of the vision of all of the various duties and responsibilities that paid and volunteer staff at the church and school are anticipated taking on over the near and medium terms. One part of this planning involves continuing with the process of determining the future administrative structure of the school.

Due to the ongoing nature of this work at the strategic planning level, the subcommittee investigating the duties and qualifications of a school administrator has temporarily put its work on hold awaiting further direction.

It is anticipated that a second joint meeting of the Trustees and School Board will take place by mid-April in advance of a meeting to further collect the thoughts of the school faculty.

### **Building and Facilities Committee:**

At the request of the Strategic Planning Committee, this committee has begun to meet to investigate the logistical requirements involved with

operating a school of 75 students within the physical parameters of our existing building. As a result of their most recent meeting several creative options are being investigated.

### **Acton Park:**

On Monday, April 24 a number of congregation members were in attendance when our plan for the development of the first 12 single-family building lots was discussed at an open hearing of Prince George's County District Council. Unfortunately we did not get the outcome we had hoped for.

Work is ongoing to try to iron out some lingering challenges in order to meet the District Council motion that the plan be resubmitted for their consideration with 60 days. Let's keep our fingers crossed.

While this is going on we are pushing forward with the initial approval phase for Phase 2, the attached dwelling (quads) portion of our plan. This is due to be addressed at a County Planning Board meeting on Thursday, April 11.

### **Church and School Flyer in the Penny Saver:**

If you live in the 20720 or 20721 zip codes keep an eye out for the Penny Saver being delivered on Wednesday, April 9. It will include a flyer promoting our church on one side and our school on the other. In total 25,000 flyers will go out.



### **“THE DOCTRINAL BASIS FOR NEW CHURCH SCHOOLS’**

All presentations begin at the church at 8:30 PM, following Friday Supper.

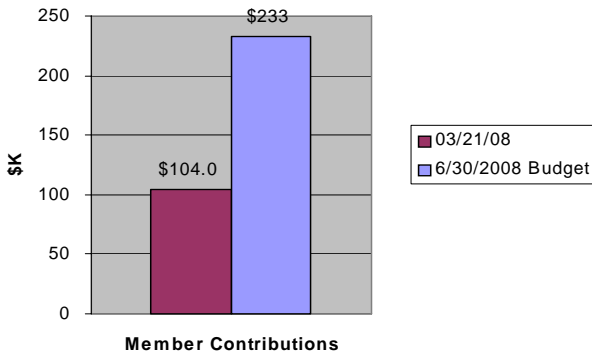

## **What's A Church?**

The English word church is interesting in that it is used to mean both a physical structure and the group of people whose hearts beat united therein. What makes a church a church? Or, as topic of the moment, what makes a better church? Do you expect this essay to talk about a building, or a congregation? Do we truly differentiate?

Appearances matter, we were recently reminded by a member of the Bishop's visiting team from Bryn Athyn. Although this remark smarts, given all that we have recently done to improve our look, in fact it is too true. As far as our building in Mitchellville goes, probably no two members of this society of the General Church see beauty the same way, but many of us dream of something better, bigger, brighter, more lovely. We long for a gorgeous space in which to celebrate our weddings and remember those who have passed on. We want something of which to be proud, something to show to visitors---at worst a symbol of our human pride, and at best our yearning to make the Lord's house more lovely than our own.

Will we be a better church when we have it?

Last night I watched my son's karate class, which meets in the most unassuming of buildings. The approach is the backside of a row of shops. Inside, despite obvious efforts to improve things, the age and wear and tear on this old building are apparent. The old red rugs peel up and are taped back to the floor; the crooked fluorescent lights cast a garish brilliance on white painted cinder block walls smudged in places. It isn't dirty, but certainly low budget. Still a happy sphere prevails there. Classes are full, the coaches look dedicated, and each class has several instructors working at one time. It's a friendly place to be. Parents converse and laugh while watching the kids learning through the one-way glass windows. Don't these people realize that appearances matter?

We ALL know that externals matter. Who in this materialistic world is in any doubt about that? Many members of the Washington New Church long to see material growth, material beauty--for instance, a working sound system, a welcoming and marked front door, a "crying room" for wigglers, a capacious, well-lighted nave! But it is nice to know that when people care about the teaching and find a place with the right heart, they can overlook the lack of physical beauty and want to be there anyway. And it is more important to this member of the church that we honor those whose hard work keeps us going.

Even more than building our external church, we must continue to better our spiritual structure, our internal church. I do believe that as we keep becoming the kind of human gathering that the Lord would want to call His church, we will find that He *is blessing us* with the resources to beautify the external. I believe that He *is sending* these blessings all the time, and that it is easy for us to become discouraged and forget to see them, right there in front of us.

It is possible to work the other way. History is replete with examples of beautiful cathedrals, palaces, and universities built on the backs of suffering serfs and slaves. Can our broader church organization, the General Church of the New Jerusalem, learn from the history of religion on this earth, or must we repeat the lack of respect for other human beings, the murder in the name of expansion, the tragedy of organized religion's murky past?

What makes a great church? Another building? Or the team of dedicated individuals---coaches and learners---who work in it for God?

If the Washington New Church can become as good a church, as welcoming, as supportive, as carefully instructive, as my son's Bowie

karate school, then this parishioner will be satisfied. Then we really will be serving the Lord in the highest sense. We'll be putting our money into spirit, not just brick.
